- 1. The Emergency Department (ED) shall be the department in LLUMC at which a parent or legal guardian may voluntarily surrender an infant within 72 hours of birth.
- 2. The ED employee who takes physical custody of such an infant shall:
 - 2.1 Facilitate a medical screening examination and any necessary medical care to the infant.

Note: Consent of the infant's parent/legal guardian or other relative is not required.

- 2.2 Provide, or make good faith effort to provide, the person surrendering custody a medical information questionnaire, which may be:
 - a. Declined,
 - b. Voluntarily completed at the time of surrender, or
 - c. Completed and mailed in the return envelope provided by the ED.
- 2.3 Place a coded, confidential identification ankle bracelet on the infant and provide, or make good faith effort to provide, the parent or custodian surrendering the infant a copy of that coded, confidential identification bracelet.
- 2.4 Promptly notify Child Protective Services (CPS) to take immediate and temporary custody of the infant.

Note: The social worker makes the initial contact and CPS will assume custody upon notification.

- 3. The infant shall receive care in the ED until determination is made for hospital admission or surrendered to CPS pursuant to court order.
- 4. If the infant requires admission to the hospital, the infant shall be admitted to the most appropriate unit for care under the direction of the pediatrician on duty.
- 5. The Division of Forensic Pediatrics shall be notified if there is suspicion of abuse or neglect (reference Policy <u>Suspected Child Abuse/Neglect/Exploitation (M-8)</u>).

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- 6. LLUMC shall surrender the infant to CPS pursuant to court order.
- 7. The person surrendering custody of the infant to LLUMC may petition CPS to retake custody. In that event, the LLUMC social worker/ED Case Manager shall interface with CPS, but the infant shall not be discharged to the surrendering person without written authorization from CPS.
