- Proposals by multiple authors, or from multiple institutions, are encouraged, though only one submission form per abstract is necessary.
- Authors of accepted abstracts will have an opportunity to share their work at Flash Sessions during the Adventist Bioethics Conference.
- Abstract presentations will be 10 minutes in length followed by 5 minutes of moderated audience response.
- Abstracts are due Friday, February 14, 2020.

Orlando International Airport is about 15 miles from AdventHealth University

Ground Transportation from airport to hotels: Taxi about \$45; Uber or Lyft about \$35.
