- 4. All personnel engaged in human studies shall be required to have current certification for education in human studies as defined and coordinated by the LLUAHSC VPRA.
- 5. In requiring IRB review of proposed research on human subjects, LLUMC affirms its commitment to the principles of human subject research ethics embodied in the Belmont Report (The National Commission for the Protection of Human Subjects of Biomedical and Behavioral Research, 1979).
- 6. In all human studies, the principal investigator shall ensure that:
 - 6.1 Informed consent is obtained in an ethical and legal manner, unless waived by the IRB
 - 6.2 Adverse events are reported to the IRB
 - 6.3 Periodic reports are submitted as required by the IRB
 - 6.4 All participating researchers, staff, and other key personnel are aware of their responsibility to comply with all applicable policies regarding human studies research.
 - 6.5 The budget for human studies adequately reimburses LLUMC for services and use of facilities.
 - NOTE: The budget for all human studies involving extramural funding shall be reviewed and approved by Sponsored Projects Financial Management in the LLUAHSC VPRA on behalf of LLUMC.
